ADULT DAY CARE ADULT DAY CARE Continued... Personnel Accomplishments:

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, the Adult Day care locations were able to serve clients in the Houston, Henry, Coffee, Covington, Geneva, Dale and Crenshaw counties. They also enrolled an average of 73 clients including 16 new enrollees, 63 state-funded clients, 9 SARCOA (Southern Alabama Regional Council on Aging) clients, and 1 private

ADC also received 100% compliance in all internal desk audits (Medicaid, SARCOA E&D Waiver, and the SARCOA ACT Waiver) center wide!

In 2023, ADC also finally received two new high-top vans to better serve their clients with safer transportation!

In 2023, Assured Data Destruction (ADD) serviced 440 routine customers at their 581 locations in Alabama, Georgia, and Florida. They also grew their customer base by adding 66 new customers and expanded their current customer base by adding 32 of their new locations. In comparison to 2022's fiscal year, ADD increased their sales

ADD operates and services the community by being mindful of three tenets:

- 1) Give opportunities for employment to individuals with challenges or physical
 - ADD personnel is comprised of 60% having challenges or physical disabilities.

2) Promote and support protection of personal information and identities.

- ADD was privileged to participate in community-wide shredding events where people could bring their confidential documents to be shredded at no charge. Many of the hosts/sponsors of these events were Friend Bank, Ozark Chamber of Commerce, and Sunset Memorial Park. At these events, ADD collected and shredded over 9,000 lbs. of documents.
 - · Also at these events, ADD collected approximately 26,000 pounds of documents from the community members, and giving them peace of mind to know that their personal information was protected and destroyed securely.

3) Promote and support the positive environmental impact of recycling paper.

- ADD collected, shredded, and recycled more than 1.1 million pounds of paper this year.
 - This saved over 9,565 trees, over 209,125 gallons of oil, and conserved over 3,850,000 gallons of water.
 - · ADD also wants to acknowledge and award Grocery Outlet as their "Environmental Partner of the Year as they utilized ADD's services to recycle nearly 31,000 pounds of paper.

 Produced 439,242 hardware bags and 156,015 pieces of track.

Michelin:

• Repaired 68,000 feet of barrier material (used in the tire-making process) per month, which equals over 800,000 feet of material repaired per year.

Pallets:

Built and shipped on average 1,350 pallets each month equaling approximately 16,000 pallets for the entire year.

Janitorial:

• Picked up two new contracts--SmartLam and Cowarts Baptist Church. They've also continued to work with the City of Dothan and the Dothan Fire Department.

<u>Community</u> <u>Programs:</u>

The R.E.A.L. Project:

- Received 1,222 pieces of donated medical equipment.
- Loaned out 1,169 items at no cost to the customer.
- Saved customers \$659,850.55 on medical equipment if they had purchased it new.

AMBUCS of the Wiregrass:

- AMBUCS has seen a major increase in the Amtryke Adaptive Tricycles over the summer months (June-August). However, despite the influx in interest, AMBUCS has placed the majority of the ordered Amtrykes on backorder until late fall or early winter.
- The AMBUCS of the Wiregrass Board of Directors has reconvened, and new roles have been assigned. The new board members have committed to attending the Amtryke fittings that will be held every other month.

Industrial Services: Dunbarton: Produced 439,242 hardware bags LAUNDRY & LINEN SERVICES

WRC's Healthcare Laundry facility processed 2.2 million pounds of soiled linen that was returned from its customers to produce 2 million pounds of clean linen.

TRSA's Certified Professional Laundry Manager (CPLM) certification was renewed for 2023. This certification verifies an established level of expertise and experience in all areas of laundry management.

The department has also purchased a new 250pound capacity dryer to complement the washers that were purchased in 2022. The dryer was purchased and installed in 2023.

The Healthcare laundry contract for Jacksonville Naval Air Station is running smoothly within WRC's in-house laundry facility adding more than 10,000 direct labor hours in our community. New opportunities for other Federal Contracts are coming soon to the Southeast region.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

WRC's Lawn & Litter Services continues to grow and improve in Fiscal Year 2023. Despite this summer being one of the hottest seasons on record. WRC's Lawn & Landscaping Services were able to not only keep up the pace but add new contracts as well. The Litter department stepped up as well, helping to keep the City of Dothan clean by picking up over 43 tons of trash along Dothan's main highways and arteries.

Program Services

- The total number of consumers that received services was 557 which was an increase from the last two years with 2022 having 412 and 2021 with 321.
 - This increase in numbers for individuals wanting rehabilitative services is positive and is indicative of a strengthening workforce.
- Individuals with disabilities or vocational barriers to employment are an untouched market that are willing to train and work.
- The demographic distribution of the consumers has remained relatively consistent over the past two years. In 2023, 72% of the consumers identified as male and 28% identified as female.
 - The ratio of males to females is 70:30 and was consistent with previous
 - Race was similar to previous years as 50% of the individuals were Caucasian and 45% were African American, leaving 5% as either Pacific Islander, Native American, or
 - The age of the consumers was also consistent with previous years. 24% of the consumers were 18 and under, 52% were between the ages of 19 and 29, and 24% were between the ages of 30 and 65.
- Program Services continues to cover 11 counties with Houston County having the largest amount of our consumers with 37%
- WRC was very successful at getting individuals jobs this year— 70 individuals were hired!
- Due to the large number of students that Program Services works with, 44% of consumers have a Specific Learning Disability, which is expected.
 - Individuals with cognitive impairments accounts for 22% of the consumers.
 - Psychological Impairments accounts for 16% of consumers, and Autism Spectrum Disorder, Blindness, Cerebral Palsy, Expressive Communication Disorder, and Physical Disabilities account for the remaining 18%.
- Supported Employment was successful this year and will become more successful over the next year as they're adding Covington County to their services!
- 8 consumers worked in the Supported Employment department and 3 of those consumers were hired full-time outside of
- A Self-Sufficiency Program will begin to help those who are receiving SNAP benefits become trained and ready to ioin the workforce.
- They're also beginning a partnership with Alabama Community College Systems to help develop supplemental training and education to the already existing members of the WRC community.
