JOB EXPLORATION TRAINING (JET) PROGRAM



FAQs about the JET Program:

- "Who funds the JET Program?"
 - The JET program is conducted by WRC personnel; however, it's funded by the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS), a division of the Vocational Rehabilitation Agency.
- "Who can participate in the JET program?"
 - Eligible participants are students entering their junior or senior year of high school and who also qualify for services with Vocational Rehabilitation Services.
- "How long does the program run?"
 - The program is a minimum of three weeks, but it can be extended longer throughout the summer. Ideally, participants will work five days a week for a minimum of 4 hours per day.
- "Do the participants get paid? If so, how much?"
 - Yes, the participants will get paid for their work! Each student will be paid \$10.00 an hour and will receive a printed paycheck or a direct deposit bi-weekly (every two weeks).
- "Is there liability insurance for the participant?"
 - All participating students will be covered under WRC's Compensation Insurance for the duration of their employment. Secondary liability insurance is available through the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS).
- "Which counties is the JET program offered in?"
 - The JET program is offered to students living in the Geneva, Dale, Coffee, Houston, Henry counties, and the city of Dothan as a whole.
- "What can I expect from the JET program?"
 - You can expect that the student will learn valuable workplace and social skills!
 Our qualified WRC staff will also be available to work with you to ensure that your work experience is successful!
